Using batteries other than the supplied ones

You can use HR 15/51:HR6 (size AA) Nickel-Metal Hydride batteries/R6 (size AA) alkaline batteries/ZR6 (size AA) Oxy Nickel Primary Battery. → "User's Guide/Troubleshooting" (page 91)

Using the AC Adaptor

You can connect the camera using the AC-LS5K AC Adaptor (not supplied). → "User's Guide/ Troubleshooting" (page 16). Refer to the operating instructions supplied with the AC Adaptor.

To check the remaining battery time

Press POWER to turn on and check the time on the LCD screen

• When the AC Adaptor (not supplied) is used, the battery remaining indicator is not displayed.

To remove the batteries

Hold the camera with the battery cover facing upward, then open the battery cover and remove the batteries. Be careful not to drop the batteries.

To use your camera abroad — Power sources

You can use your camera, the supplied battery charger, and the AC Adaptor (not supplied) in any country or region where the power supply is within 100 V to 240 V AC, 50/60 Hz. Use a commercially available AC plug adaptor [a], if necessary, depending on the design of the wall outlet (wall socket) [b].



• Do not use an electronic transformer (travel converter), as this may cause a malfunction.



To change the date and time

Select [Clock Set] in the 🚔 (Setup) screen and perform the procedure in step 3 above. → "User's Guide/Troubleshooting" (page 54)

On the clock display

• If you selected [D/M/Y] in step 3-1, set the time on a 24-hour cycle. • Midnight is indicated as 12:00 AM, and noon as 12:00 PM.

When turning on the power

• Unless you set the clock, the Clock Set screen appears each time the camera is turned on. • Do not touch the lens portion as the cover opens and the lens portion extends. Also, do not leave the camera with the lens portion extended for a long period of time with the power off as this may cause malfunction • The following screen appears when the camera is turned on for the second time or afterwards.



To turn off the powe

Press POWER again. • If the camera is running on battery power and you do not operate the camera for a period of time, the camera turns off automatically to prevent wearing down the battery (Auto power-off function)

Changing the language setting

You can change the screen display to show messages in a specified language. To change the language setting, press MENU to display the menu screen. Select 🚔 (Setup) with the control button, then, select [A Language] in \blacksquare (Setup1), and select the desired language. \rightarrow "User's *Guide/Troubleshooting*" (page 52)

To delete images

- 1 Display the image you want to delete and press 🗰 / 📺 (delete).
- **2** Select [Delete] with \blacktriangle , then press \bigcirc .

To view an enlarged image (playback zoom)

While displaying a still image, press \oplus to zoom in on the image. To undo the zoom, press \bigcirc . Adjust the portion: A/V/4/Cancel playback zoom:

Viewing an index screen

Press \blacksquare (index), then select an image with $\blacktriangle/ \bigtriangledown / \checkmark / \blacklozenge$.

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To return to the single-image screen, press ●. To display the next (previous) index screen, press ◀/▶









If you press again, the sixteen-image index screen appears.

To delete images in index mode

- 1 While an index screen is displayed, press $\frac{1}{2}$ / $\frac{1}{2}$ (Delete) and select [Select] with A/V on the control button, then press lacksquare.
- **2** Select the image you want to delete with A/V/A/b, then press \bullet to display the \overleftarrow{m} (Delete) indicator on the selected image.



To cancel a selection

Select an image you have previously selected for deletion, then press \bullet to delete the \overleftarrow{m} indicator from the image.

- 3 Press 🛄 / 🛅 (Delete).
- **4** Select [OK] with \blacktriangleright , then press \bigcirc .
- To delete all the images in the folder, select [All In This Folder] with \blacktriangle/ ∇ in step 1 instead of [Select], then press •.
